Orchard Map

As part of the Monitoring Plan for your orchard, attach to your records an orchard map showing:

- Orchard boundaries
- Boundaries of avocado blocks, and block name or number
- Access routes
- Buildings and other physical landmarks
- Shelter belts
- Hectares
- Plantings in other blocks and Neighboring crops/land, e.g. bees, kiwifruit, citrus (sources of pests)
- Boundary and a unique identifier of each Sampling Area
- If sampling is from Marked Trees, the approximate position of each should be shown
- Any hazards
- Date of map

Monitoring Schedule (Calendar) – timing of monitoring rounds

As part of the Monitoring Plan for your orchard, attach your records either as a marked seasonal calendar (November to October) showing the key activities (harvesting, flowering, bees in orchard) and intended Monitoring Dates **OR** otherwise describe in a document when each monitoring round is planned. You must record the dates on the calendar and on the Monitoring Sheets of when the actual monitoring was completed.

Pre-harvest quarantine monitor: A (1) pre-harvest quarantine monitor will be undertaken within 28 days prior to harvest if no other monitoring has occurred within 28 days of harvest.
